THE ROLE

Lead the training activities for Process Plant supervisors and mechanical maintainers with the aim of providing effective operational tools in their different areas and assigned controls, providing fundamentals, practices and implementation of safe operational controls while improving practices for the fulfillment of production plans, based on company guidelines.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provides assistance to the superintendent, maintenance general manager and shift supervisors on the skill guidelines of the staff to be trained.
- Establishes plans, schedules and evaluations of the training program.
- Based on bibliographic material, IOM manuals and control philosophies, prepares maintenance procedures for plan activities as well as corrective action activities for the operation areas in conjunction with maintenance managers and supervisors.
- Reviews – along with management, superintendency, and plant maintenance managers – the training plans, operational procedures and their application on the field.
- Verbal and written weekly progress reports on the field trainings.
- The training supervisor must comply with all H&S and environmental guidelines.
- Throughout the training period, ensures that the staff being trained correctly uses and maintains the equipment, tools and other assets assigned to the operating unit, ensuring that the activities have the proper safety and quality control.
- Identifies and ensures that all maintenance activities have the necessary materials, spare parts and tools for guaranteeing the correct performance of each task.
- Is required to review, on the field, that the training plans are in accordance with the outlined objectives and is also required to make all necessary corrections.
- Ensure that the trainers follow the manuals and procedures concerning the operation and essential care of plant equipment.
- Plan and coordinate the training activities with the operations superintendent.
